Our Goals for Student Achievement

2024-2025 Hall County District Goals

Goal 1: By the end of FY25, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance.

Goal 2: By the end of FY25, Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCSD by 1%.

2024-2025 The Foundry Goals

Goal 1: By the end of FY25, at least 75% of high school students enrolled in person at The Foundry will have successfully completed three Direct Taught and/or Edgenuity courses in order to raise the Foundry graduation rate by 5%.

Goal 2: For FY25, 100% of The Foundry middle school will complete their program portfolio, encompassing the H.C.S.D. literacy components in order to increase the English Language Arts, End of Grade scores for 6th, 7th, and 8th grade by a cumulative average of 5%.

Goal 3: For FY25, all Foundry students will actively participate in a daily Social and Emotional Learning program, “Real Time”, which will increase the graduation rate by 5%.

Goal 4: For FY25, The Foundry Staff will increase parent and family involvement in school activities by 5%.

Teachers, Parents, and Students--Together for Success

Teacher/School Responsibilities:

- Hold parent-teacher conferences to discuss and monitor student progress and review student achievement data in all academic areas.
- Utilize the Infinite Campus, Canvas, Edgenuity, and The Foundry website to communicate and share instructional strategies and materials with parents.
- Hold parent workshops on campus or via home visits
- Hold Induction and Transition Meetings upon arrival and transfer from The Foundry
- Provide resources for all academic areas through teacher websites, Edgenuity, Canvas, and the Georgia DOE Online Assessment site, which provides parents with tools to prepare your child for the EOC tests.

Family Responsibilities

- Attend parent-teacher induction, transition meetings, and individual conferences to discuss student progress and achievement data.
- Participate in workshops and visit the school’s website for updated information.
- Follow the achievement plans created for my student and promote using resources found on teacher’s Canvas websites, USA Test Prep, and the GA DOE Online Assessment site to help my student prepare for testing and ensure that students participate in credit recovery opportunities if needed.
- Hold discussions with children that promote sharing about the strategies and activities from teacher taught and Edgenuity classes to increase academic achievement with the goal of graduation.

Student Responsibilities:

- Attending school daily, commit fully to Real Time, maintain/ exceed daily percentage requirements and passing grades in order to improve EOC scores and increase the number of credits earned to stay on track for graduation
- Discuss class activities in Real Time and Edgenuity with parents and read/study daily to increase academic achievement in all content areas.
